



PRESIDENTIAL NOMINATING PRIMARY ELECTION

March 5, 2024

Polls are open 7 a.m.-8 p.m.

On March 5th, Minnesota will participate in Super Tuesday by holding a Presidential Nominating Primary Election. Voters must declare a party in order to vote, since each political party participating in the election has a separate ballot with its own presidential candidates. St. Michael is divided into four precincts for elections. Below is the map of precinct boundaries and the list of polling places for each precinct. Polls will be open from 7am-8pm on March 5th for voting.

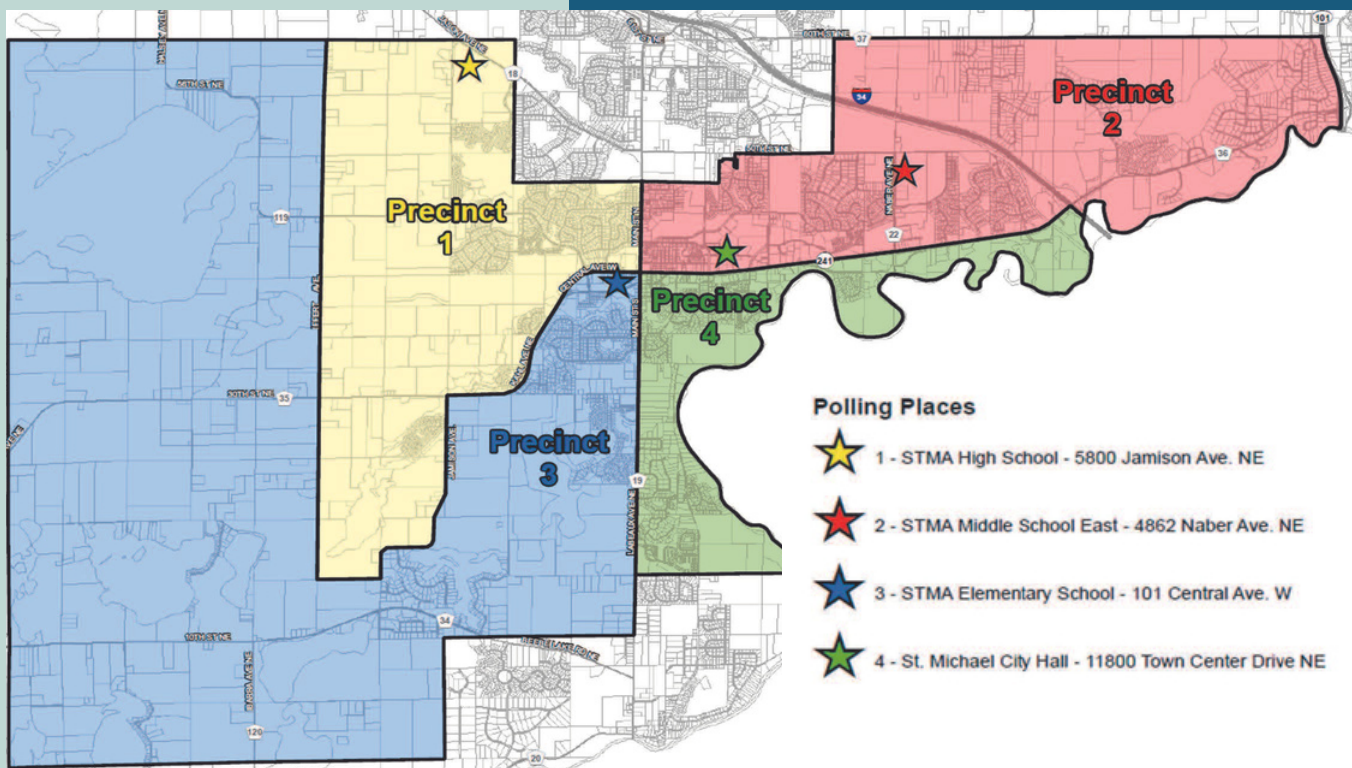
If your name or address has changed since the last election, you may need to register to vote. Registration can be done at the polls on election day as long as proper proof of residence is provided.

Absentee ballots are available at City Hall if you would like to vote early. Absentee voting started on January 19th and is available during regular City Hall office hours and on Saturday, March 2nd from 10am-3pm.

SPRINKLING RESTRICTIONS

To ensure adequate water supply for fire protection in the summer months, water use for the purposes of sprinkling is restricted to between the hours of 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 a.m. from June 1 through September 30. Residents with even house numbers water on even days, and those with odd house numbers water on odd days. New sod and seed is exempt for 60 days. You must notify the Water Department at 763-497-3611 prior to installation.

The annual public storm water meeting will be held on June 11 at 7 p.m. in the Council Chambers.

BURNING PERMITS

All permits in St. Michael need to be obtained through the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources at www.dnr.state.mn.us/forestry/fire/questions/html. There you can also find burning restriction information.

COMPOST BRUSH SITE

Residents of St. Michael have 24-hour access to the compost/brush drop site located at 3150 Lander Avenue NE. If you need an access card, stop by City Hall or visit stmichaelmn.gov/compost to complete a request form and mail to City Hal.

PROPERTY VALUES AND BOARD OF APPEAL MEETING

Property valuations for the 2024 assessment year will be out in mid-March. It is important to note that an increasing value does not necessarily mean an increase in taxes, which are based on the tax levy spread among all properties.

The Board of Appeal and Equalization is set for Tuesday, April 23, at 6 p.m. This is a time to appeal the value on your property. It is also helpful to keep leaves and grass out of streets, driveways, ponds and wetlands. Please report all illicit storm water discharges to the City.

USED OIL DROP 3150 Lander Ave NE

Next to the compost site, there is a drop site for the public to dispose of used oil at no charge. No gasoline or solvents are accepted. The cost for disposal of oil filters is 50 cents per filter and \$1/gallon of antifreeze.
