Become an Elected Official

The Mayor and two Council Member positions will be up for election in November, with the terms beginning January 1, 2023. The Mayor serves a two-year term and the Council Members serve four-year terms. There are three requirements to be eligible for either office: you must be an eligible voter, 21 years old upon assuming office and a resident of St. Michael 30 days prior to the General Election on November 8, 2022. County Road 19 Improvements

Wright County will be making improvements to CSAH 19 (Main Street) in the area of the Highway 241 one-way pair from Ash Ave NE to Carissa Ln SW. The project will include pavement reconstruction, intersection improvements, and roadway geometric improvements to enhance safety, increase capacity, and reduce delay through the corridor. The road work north of the one-way pair to Ash Ave NE will be completed under traffic but expect delays and watch for lane shifts and traffic control changes throughout the duration of the project. In conjunction with the County project, the City of St. Michael will be replacing the watermain and rehabilitating the sanitary sewer located underneath CSAH 19. The watermain construction will require a closure of CSAH 19 south of the one-way pairs to Carissa LN SW starting in late July. The road will be reopened in early September and the remainder of the project will be completed under traffic with final project completion estimated for early November 2022.

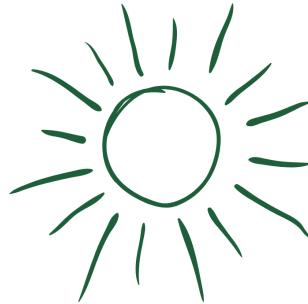

SCOOP THE POOP

- It pollutes and contaminates our water.

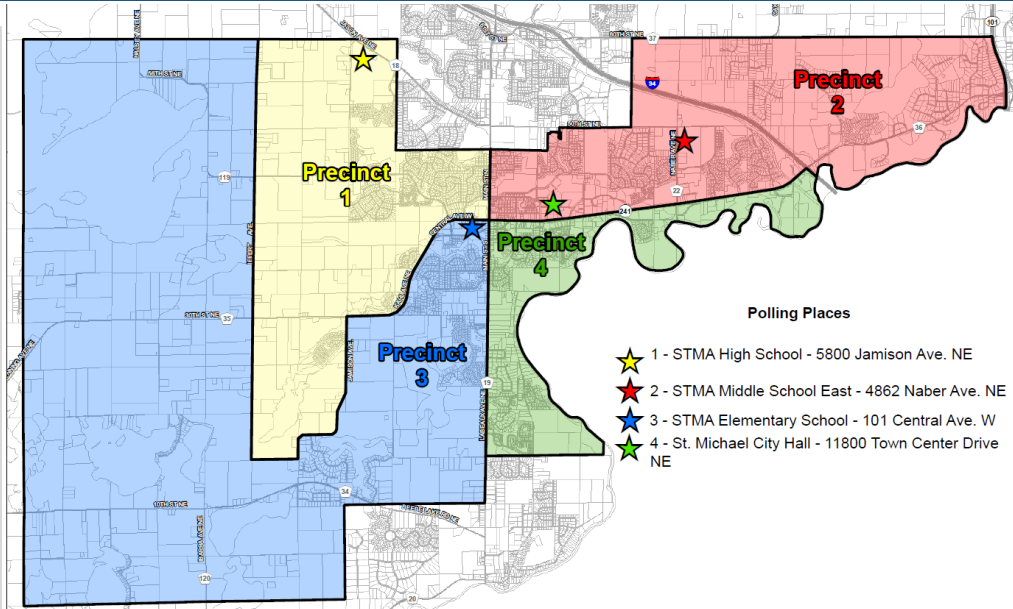
City ordinance requires dog waste to be immediately cleaned up unless on your private property, which must be disposed of with best management and shall not accumulate in any manner.

Even “Flushable” Wipes Aren’t Flushable!

Many wipes claim they are safe to flush, but they do not break down and cause sanitary sewer backups. Homeowners can expect to experience plumbing issues with heavy bills for flushing these wipes, causing sewer system problems for the community. Keep all wipes out of the septic and sewer system!

STATE PRIMARY ELECTION- AUGUST 9 GENERAL ELECTION- NOVEMBER 8

St. Michael is now divided into four precincts for voting. Above is the map showing the new precinct boundaries as well as the four polling places. You must register to vote if you are a new resident, have moved to another precinct in the City, or have not voted at least once during a four-year period. Absentee voting is available at City Hall prior to election day for both the Primary and General Election. Primary Election Day is August 9th and General Election Day is November 8th. 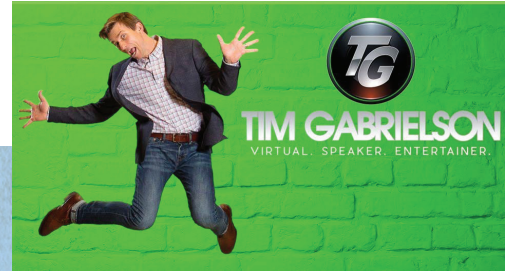

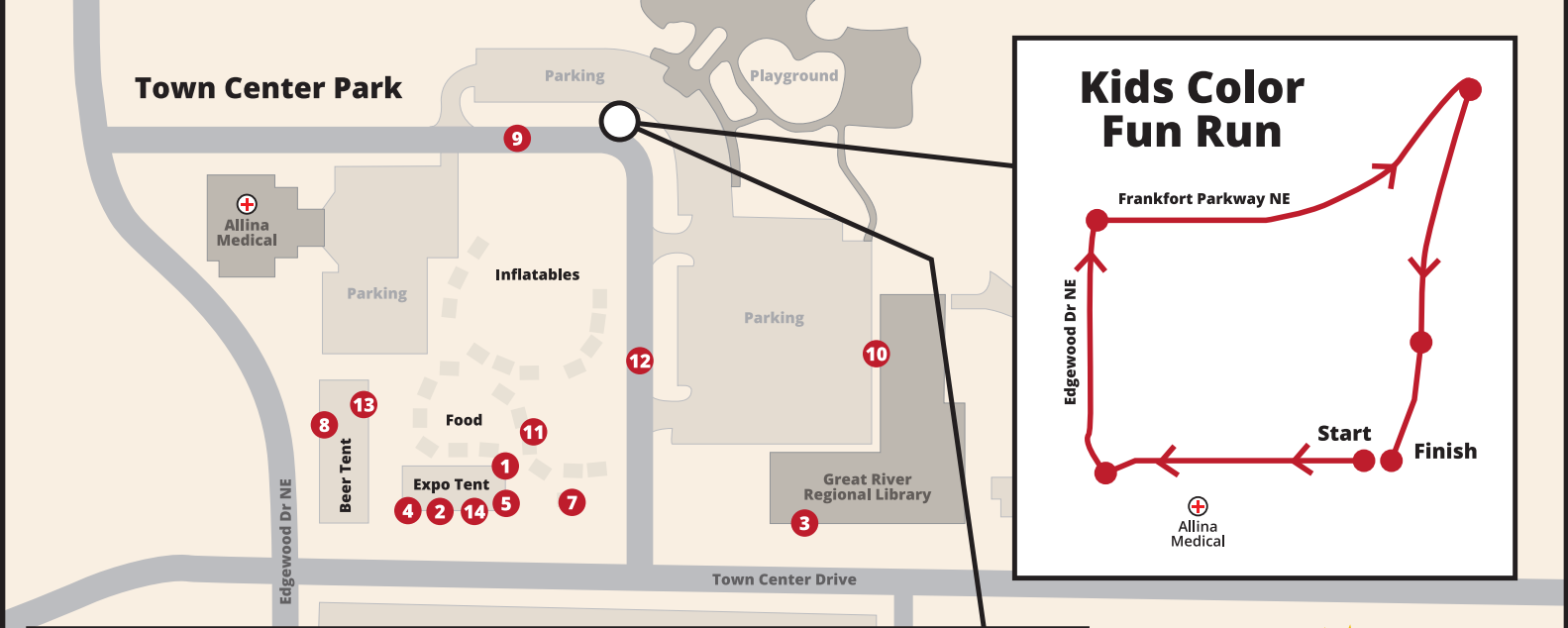

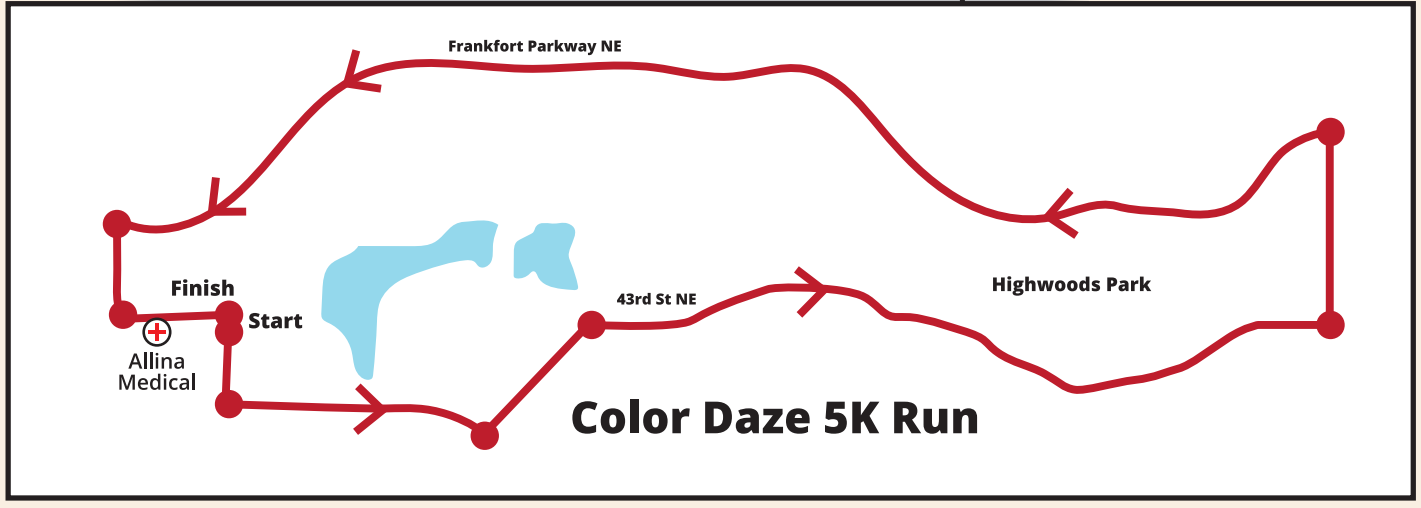
